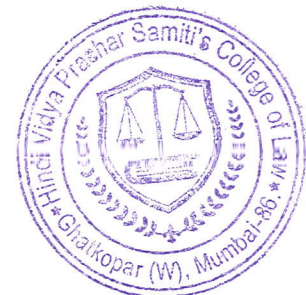

- Do not narrate the entire story of the case.
- Clearly identify the legal issue—this is essential.
- Mention relevant constitutional provisions/articles wherever applicable.



- Viral posts and videos spread rapidly, including some misleading information

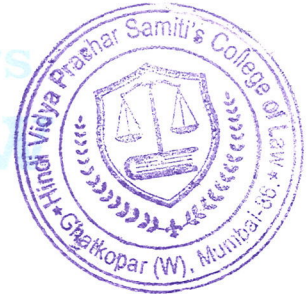
Public is divided:
